## **NES Bird Pen Policy**

The chapter bird pen is located on the training grounds at Ahearn's Farm in Dayton. The pen will be stocked with chukar to provide additional training opportunities for the membership. The pen will be monitored by camera for vandalism.

- Contact the chapter Treasurer to register and receive the lock combination
- Members are asked to follow the procedures posted at the pen to minimize risk of bird loss
- Members to provide personal bird bags, the chapter will provide a net at the pen
- Members are financially responsible for all birds removed or released (escapees) while accessing the pen
- Members must follow chapter policy for Training on Non Clinic Days at Ahearn's Farm as detailed in the Members Only section of the website (current NES members only, no guests permitted)
- Members to leave payment (cash or check) in envelope with name, date, birds in Drop Box located at bird pen. All payments are due day of access, no exceptions. Current pricing will be posted at Drop Box.
- Birds to be used on the training grounds at Ahearn's Farm only
- Members are limited to 3 birds maximum per week
- Birds available on first come first serve basis, no reservations
